Dear Vice-Chancellor Paul Wellings,

Re: Transmittal Letter of the International EMF Scientist Appeal

We are contacting you due to the recent controversies that have resulted from the February 2016 broadcasting of the Australian Broadcast Corporation (ABC) TV Show "Catalyst" about health dangers of electromagnetic fields (EMF) emitted by Wi-Fi.

We want to bring to your attention the International EMF Scientist Appeal. This Appeal was submitted to the top leaders at the United Nations, the World Health Organization and the United Nations Environmental Program on May 11, 2015. It is signed by 220 EMF-scientists from 42 nations, each of whom has published EMF papers in peer reviewed journals that show biological or health effects from manmade sources of non-ionizing radiation on human health and the environment.

Importantly, these scientists are reporting biological/health effects due to EMF exposure at intensities that are below the guidelines set by international organizations. For more details, we refer you to the text of the Appeal, which is attached.
