POISONED WATER

March 4, 5pm

NOVA investigates what happened in Flint, Michigan when short-sighted local officials changed the city's water source to save money resulting in avoidable lead poisoning.

GENERATION ZAPPED

An eye-opening 2017 documentary that investigates the untold story of the serious health risks of wireless technology, featuring scientists and public health experts.

COMPLICIT

This documentary follows the intimate journey of Chinese migrant worker Yi Yeting, a benzene-poisoned victim-turned-activist fighting work-induced leukemia, as he challenged the global electronics industry.

MERCHANTS OF DOUBT

A documentary exposing scientists-for-hire who present themselves as authorities on toxic chemicals, pharmaceuticals, Without disclosing who's paying them.

TOXIC HOT SEAT

This film follows a courageous group of firefighters, mothers, journalists and scientists, politicians and activists as they expose the shadowy campaign that led legislators to pass laws requiring toxic flame retardants.
