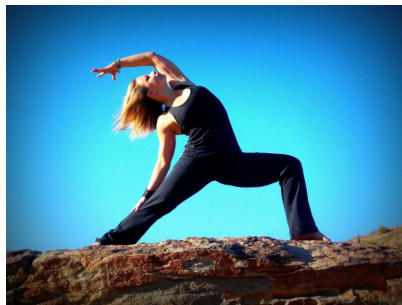


October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

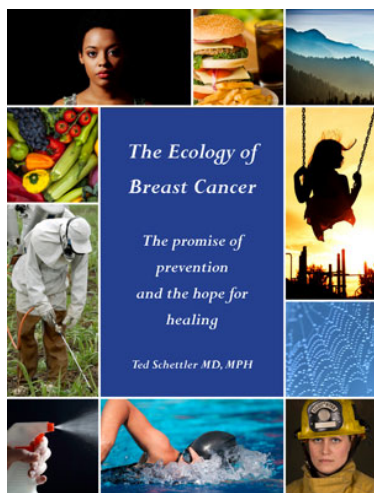

Pinkwashing: A company or organization that claims to care about breast cancer by promoting a pink ribbon product, but at the same time produces, manufactures and/or sells products that are linked to the disease. For example, using oil wastewater to irrigate our citrus is not safe.
